Information on joining and paying fees

Dear potential member, dear parents,

we would like to give you a few details about membership of TKD. Please keep this letter so that you can refer to it if necessary. Please give the completed membership application form to your instructor.

Please ensure that all necessary columns are completed. A telephone number is required for children.

You can view the statutes from your exercise instructor, at the office or on the Internet.

The **monthly** membership fees are as follows:

(as at 01.01.2019)

Adults (over 18)	11.50 €
Married couples	16.00 €
Pensioner couples (both over 65)	12.00 €
Pensioners (over 65)	9.50 €
Young people (over 14 and under 18)	9.50 €
Students and trainees	9.50 €
Children (under 14 years)	9.00 €
Passive members	7.00 €

The admission fee is 3 monthly fees. If you come from a member club of the DTB (German Gymnastics Federation), the admission fee is waived if less than 3 months have passed.

The fees are collected by direct debit at the beginning of January and the beginning of July. No other method of payment is possible. Please ensure that your account has sufficient funds. The bank is now charging €8.25 for a return. Unfortunately, we will have to pass this amount on to you if you initiate an unjustified return.

If you are a trainee or student, please enclose a certificate and you will receive a reduced fee. Please send us your current certificate of enrolment by 30 November each year. If a young person turns 18 and is still in training, they pay the contribution for students and trainees. Please also send us a certificate in this case.

For low-income families, the contribution can be paid by the Office for Social Affairs and Housing via the education and participation package. Please contact the relevant office.

The 3rd and each additional child is free of charge.

Special regulations apply for passive members.

You or your child can then take part in all the relevant activities of the sports club without paying any further contribution (with the exception of courses). Courses are to be paid for separately and do not require membership.

Membership includes sports accident insurance, which covers you if other insurances (e.g. health insurance) are no longer responsible. In the event of an accident, please inform the trainer if he/she does not register the accident on his/her own initiative. A damage report must be written in any case.

Please submit your resignation in writing to the office 1 month before the end of the half-year. Please inform the office of any changes of name, address or bank account. Please bear in mind:

Absence from training sessions does not mean resignation.

We also ask you to attend training regularly and to encourage your child to do so. This is the only way to ensure training success.

No liability can be accepted for clothing, valuables etc. during training. If you have any questions, please contact your trainer or the office. You can also find detailed information on our website.

We hope that you or your child will feel at home with us and wish you every success.

Information obligations under Articles 13 and 14 GDPR

3. purposes for which personal data is processed:

Personal data is processed for the purpose of implementing the membership relationship (e.g. invitation to meetings, collection of membership fees, organisation of sports activities).

Furthermore, personal data will be forwarded to the state professional associations for participation in competitions, tournaments and matches.

In addition, personal data in connection with sporting events, including reporting on these events, is published on the club's website, in the club's social media presence and on the websites of the professional associations and transmitted to local, regional and national print media.

4. legal bases on which the processing takes place:

The processing of personal data is generally carried out due to the necessity for the fulfilment of a contract in accordance with Article 6 para. 1 lit. b) GDPR. The contractual relationships are primarily the membership relationship in the club and participation in the match operations of the professional associations.

If personal data is collected without the processing being necessary for the fulfilment of the contract, the processing is based on consent in accordance with Article 6 para. 1 lit. a) in conjunction with Article 7 GDPR. Article 7 GDPR.

The publication of personal data on the Internet or in local, regional or supra-regional print media is carried out to protect the legitimate interests of the association (see Article 6 para. 1 lit. f) GDPR). The legitimate interest of the association is to inform the public by reporting on the activities of the association. In this context, personal data including pictures of the participants are published, for example in the context of reporting on sporting events of the association.

5. the recipients or categories of recipients of the personal data:

Personal data of members who participate in the match and competition operations of the state professional associations are passed on to the respective state professional association in order to acquire a licence, a rating card, a player's pass or other entitlement to participate.

Members' bank account details are forwarded to Deutsche Bank for the purpose of collecting membership fees.

6. the duration for which the personal data will be stored or, if this is not possible, the criteria for determining the duration:

The personal data will be stored for the duration of the membership.

Upon termination of membership, the data categories are stored for a further ten years in accordance with the statutory retention periods and then deleted. In the period between termination of membership and deletion, the processing of this data is restricted.

Certain categories of data are partially stored in the association's archive for the purpose of the association's chronicle. These are the categories first name, surname, membership of a team, special sporting successes or events in which the person concerned has participated. The storage is based on the club's legitimate interest in the historical documentation of sporting events and successes and the respective composition of the teams.

All data in the other categories (e.g. bank details, address, contact details) will be deleted upon termination of membership.

7. the data subject is entitled to the following rights under the conditions specified in the articles:

§ the right to information in accordance with Article 15 GDPR,

§ the right to rectification in accordance with Article 16 GDPR,

§ the right to erasure in accordance with Article 17 GDPR,

§ the right to restriction of processing in accordance with Article 18 GDPR

§ the right to data portability pursuant to Article 20 GDPR,

§ the right to object pursuant to Article 21 GDPR,

§ the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority in accordance with Article 77 GDPR

§ the right to withdraw consent at any time without affecting the lawfulness of processing based on consent before its withdrawal.

8. the source from which the personal data originates:

The personal data is generally collected as part of the acquisition of membership.
